The Mitcham to Syndal Water Mains (M22 and M46)

Melbourne Water is committed to enhancing life and liveability in your area. To ensure we continue to supply our customers and the wider community with a safe and reliable water supply, we are upgrading water mains between Mitcham and Syndal.

Melbourne Water is replacing three aging sections of water mains between Mitcham and Syndal. The water mains comprise of two pipelines, the M22 main constructed in 1927 and the M46 main constructed in 1912. Sections of the M22 and M46 water mains are nearing the end of their service life.

This work will ensure Melbourne Water can continue to supply our customers and the wider community with a safe and reliable water supply now and into the future.



Works program

Melbourne Water is replacing sections of the M22 and M46 water mains and installing a singular new 1150-1350mm diameter water main.

There are four separate sections associated with this Works Program:

Section A is from Percy Street to the intersection of Springvale and Canterbury Road, Forest Hill.

Section B is from the intersection of Hawthorn and Mahoneys Road to Aston Court, Burwood East.

Section C is is from Cherry Street to Price Avenue, Glen Waverley.

Section D is the abandonment of the M22 between Waverley Road Basin and Monash Freeway, Mt Waverley.

Most work will be within Melbourne Water's 'pipe track' or grassed reserve. However, the pipeline does cross under some roads, including Burwood Highway in Burwood and High Street Road in Glen Waverley.





Mitcham to Syndal Water Mains Renewal Project

What to expect

Whilst we will make every effort to ensure inconveniences are kept to a minimum, there will be some localised impacts:

Working hours

The majority of construction works will occur during standard construction hours between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 7am and 3pm Saturdays.

Nightworks may be required where the pipeline crosses under roads to minimise traffic disruption. Residents and businesses will be advised if works are necessary outside of these hours.

Noise and vibration

Some noise and vibration are expected during construction from trucks, machinery and reversing beepers. We will work closely with the appointed contractor to manage noise impacts as much as practicable.

Impacts on local traffic and streets

There will be some minor changes to the traffic conditions, including car park closures, lane closures, speed limit reductions and some street closures while we work on local roads.

To complete our works safely, there will be changes to local traffic conditions. Approved traffic management contractors will be used to direct traffic, pedestrians and cyclists safely around our worksites.

Local communities will be provided with more information about expected changes to traffic conditions, including the timing of planned activities, changes to traffic, access and parking conditions before starting work at each location. We will work closely with local Councils and the appointed construction contractor to stage the works to minimise impacts on local traffic.
