## North Yarra Main Sewer Rehabilitation

## **Relining night works starting 3 April 2024**

We will be completing relining works on the North Yarra Main Sewer between Burgundy Street and Banksia Street. The sewer line will be cleaned prior to relining, and large trucks and machinery will be used to install the spiral wound liner and CCTV vans to scan the line.

Works are scheduled to start on **Wednesday, 3 April 2024** and are expected to take 5-6 weeks to complete.

## What to expect?

- Traffic management will be present to assist motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians around our temporary work sites. Short detours will be required where manholes are in intersections. Please allow extra time when travelling through the area.
- Noise will be generated from the relining equipment. This noise can be compared to a lawn mower.
- Odour will be present when opening and accessing the maintenance hole. While smelly, it's harmless and will disappear when we finish.
- Bright lights will be used during night works. Where possible, lights will be directed away from neighbouring properties.
- Reduced parking on Burgundy Street near maintenance hole NYM126-505 and on The Boulevard near NYM119.
