It is your responsibility to ensure works are completed to the standard required in your contract with Melbourne Water and in a timely, safe and environmentally sensitive way.

To assist with this process Melbourne Water has identified a list of hazards that should be considered by council, when managing the risks that each project poses, they include but are not limited to:

- Steep difficult terrain
- Trenches deeper than 1.5 meters
- Fire risk
- Work on/over/near water
- Electrical hazards
- Drilling operations including setup
- Explosion risk
- Traffic management

- Industrial/ Construction site risks
- Equipment set up
- chemical exposure
- Sampling from dam/drains
- Restricted access
- Confined spaces
- Working at heights
- High flow event risks

Hazards encountered through office based work include incorrect workstation set-up, poor lighting, poor layout of furniture and equipment, poor housekeeping, electrical hazards and equipment hazards

Permit to Work

For works performed in or on a Melbourne Water asset, plant, land, equipment or building, you may require a permit before the commencement of works. Please contact your Living Rivers Regional Stormwater Coordinator for assistance in this matter.
