What is the Chain of Ponds?

The Chain of Ponds is an ambitious collaboration to **“transform the Moonee Ponds Creek into an iconic waterway for Melbourne that provides high social and environmental benefits”** with 17 partner organisations committed to achieving this goal.

Transforming the creek will provide numerous benefits to local communities living in and around the creek catchment

ENVIRONMENT

- The creek corridor supports a healthy ecology and connected habitat.
- Water management is holistic and driven by innovation

SOCIAL

- The catchment supports a vibrant and well connected waterway corridor and an active, healthy and happy community
- The waterway corridor supports appropriate urban development and provides quality open space
- Cultural heritage and traditional owners of the creek corridor are acknowledged and celebrated

ECONOMIC

- Green infrastructure considerations are imbedded in all investment across the catchment
- The economic and social vitality of local communities and businesses are supported

Chain of Ponds collaboration will enable outcomes for the creek catchment through coordination activities and advocacy.


COORDINATION

- Developing a portal of data and mapping for easy sharing.
- Leveraging opportunities to deliver on strategic actions aligning with multi-agency targets and objectives.
- Developing guidelines to inform private and public space development around the creek.

ADVOCACY

- Seeking new, and leveraging existing, funding for large on-ground infrastructure projects or for programs such as education, research and catchment modelling.
- Ensuring development proposed in the catchment does not preclude realisation of the long-term vision.
- Supporting lead partners and organisations in delivery of larger capital projects

The Chain of Ponds Collaboration does things differently.

- Takes a whole-of-catchment approach to governance and project management
- Identifies collaborative opportunities for the catchment that cannot be realised in isolation;
- Develops and implements ideas and strategies for catchment protection and enhancement;
- Works collaboratively to influence major urban renewal and infrastructure projects that impact on the Creek corridor;
- Protects and enhances biodiversity, habitat and biolinks along the Creek corridor;
- Ensures approaches to development and waterway improvement are consistent with established strategic directions across the catchment and are based on best practice;
- Enables a mechanism to consider options for co-investment in meaningful projects; enables stronger advocacy for waterway management issues, e.g. through strategic and statutory planning mechanisms.
- Ongoing group meetings, communications, and engagement of senior management in collaborating organisations


